### Agenda items:

1- *Review last meeting's notes and give final approval:*

Minutes were edited slightly for a couple of incomplete areas and then vote to approve was unanimous.

2- *Update on action items:*

Last month's action items were discussed. Laurie was asked to do an item for May's PTA newsletter instead of April as there is already an article ready to go for April.

3- CSIP Plan:

The school will primarily focus on ELA for their academic goal as historically there has not been an upward trend in student proficiency in this academic area. Goals were set in ELA, math, and school climate. Goals were consistent in each area to improve by 2 basis points over the scores of the previous year. The assessments that will be used to measure the goal are DIBELSnet for K-2 students and SAGE for 3-5 students as well as the Tiered Fidelity Inventory (for school climate goal). To monitor progress throughout the year, we will look at DIBELs, SRI, and district-wide assessments data. It was proposed to spend the allocated LAND Trust funding on the following:

- 3 Reading Aides and 2 math aides: \$32,000
- Teacher Professional Development: \$1,200
- Substitutes for Professional Development: \$2,400
- 2 aides to support Behavior and Academic goals: \$15,000
- iPad lab: \$8,893

All members present signed the signature form for the 2017-18 Comprehensive School Improvement Plan (CSIP) and the School LAND Trust Plan.

4- Update on school happenings

- a. DIBELS results from January's testing:  
Data was shared from all grade levels. In Reading K-2, we averaged 76% proficient, close to our end-of-year goal. In grades 3-5 the average was 83% of students were proficient in at least one of the measures (DIBELSnet or SRI). In math K-2, we averaged 58% proficient, with concerns in kindergarten and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade specifically. In grades 3-5 we averaged 77% proficient, close to our end-of-year goal.
- b. Jog-a-thon planning:  
Plans are set for May 12<sup>th</sup>.
- c. Literacy Month:  
March 21<sup>st</sup> is Literacy Night which PTA is sponsoring. The school looks great and students are enjoying the Harry Potter theme with literacy.

Action Items:
